

#### We enriched student learning and research:

- We mentored 12 undergraduate students who developed >300 pages of research for the arboretum website.
- We provided classroom talks and access to the collection for classes that use the grounds as a living laboratory.
- We provided plant samples for US genomics research.

#### We established partnership with university operations:

 We partnered with UA Planning Design and Construction, who now professionally manage the arboretum tree database and provided new technology for UA Grounds Services to improve campus tree care.

#### We educated and inspired the public:

- We presented talks and training throughout the state reaching >800 community members and landscape professionals.
- We hosted 25 guided tree tours and 4 poetry reading events in 2018 reaching more than 200 participants.

#### We promoted sustainable landscape development:

- We earned our 9th Tree Campus USA recognition.
- We advocated for tree protection and preservation during construction and planted new trees on campus.
