



Focus on:

Punica granatum

"pomegranate"

Lythraceae



P. granatum is a shrub or small tree that grows 12 to 20 feet. The showy flowers, located on the branch tips have 3-7 red, white or variegated petals arranged like ruffles spilling out of the vase shaped calyx below. The much-loved fruit has a rough rubbery covering that surrounds the tart, juicy arils containing the seeds. This a very storied plant, featured in Egyptian mythology, religious texts, and art. The plant thrives in semi-arid climates and tolerates a variety of soil types. The seeds of the pomegranate are eaten plain or added to salads, juiced, or fermented. The juice is high in antioxidants and used traditionally to treat conditions from bronchitis, high blood pressure, hardening of the arteries, and high cholesterol.
